Vision & Visionaries

The DAV Institutions are the gift of Arya Samaj, a progressive movement founded by Swami Dayanand Saraswati in 1875. Swami Dayanand Saraswati, the great path-maker of modern India, led a crusade against the superstitious and pernicious practices that prevailed in contemporary India.

With a view to bring about a balanced and harmonious development of the future citizens of this country and to infuse in them the ideals of Vedic Culture and high sense of patriotism, Arya Samaj founded a school, in Lahore in 1886 by the name of DAYANAND ANGLO VEDIC SCHOOL.

The Cherished Memory of

Mahatma Narayan Das Grover is the founding father of Arya Gyan Prachar Samiti and Bhishma Pitamaha of the DAV family. He was a Karmayogi in the real sense with great courage, believed in creation with broader vision for humanity. He was a great Acharya and philanthropist who reigned in the hearts and minds of millions of poor & underprivileged.

In 1981, a group of visionary citizens and Philanthropist Mahatma N.D. Grover, as our Yugdrastha (Leader) has opened many schools in Bihar, Jharkhand & Orissa. In this chain Mahatma had decided that Bundu sub-divisional headquarter, needed schools that would yield "self-discipline".

"Arya Gyan Prachar Samiti" (Regd. under society registration Act 1860 in Jharkhand) is equal to the ideological groups of social activities, social reformers, renowned educational, professional and social workers.

The Arya Gyan Prachar Samiti is having two reputed schools at Ranchi, DAV Nandraj Public School, Bariatu affiliated to CBSE up to class X, and DAV Nandraj Modern school, Bardwan Compound and Orphanage, Bariatu & Old Age Home (Senior Citizen), Bariatu are also running.

Mahatma N D Grover DAV Public School, Bundu is a progressive child centered co-educational CBSE pattern school managed by (Arya Gyan Prachar Samiti) Ranchi. The school has been catering to the needs of students for 3 years from class pre-primary and will be upgraded to class XII year by year for providing complete schooling of students of Panch Pargana (Bundu, Tamar, Arki and Sonahatu). The school aims to achieve high academic standard with all round development of character and personality of students. Stress is given on vocational training to make the students independent, self-confident and self employed.



Aims & Objectives

The school provides a congenial environment for all round development of the whole personality and its integration in students as regards personal hygiene, neatness of uniform, cleanliness of surroundings, graceful manners, obedience and discipline. To achieve high academic standards personal attention is given to each individual child.

The school has a staff of highly qualified, dedicated and experienced teachers.

The strength and success of D.A.V. Nandraj Public School lies in the harmonious blend of science and technology and a sound grounding of ancient Vedic Culture.

The aim of D.A.V Nandraj School is to inculcate in the students a thirst for knowledge, devotion to duty, honesty, patriotic fervour besides humanism. We impart an education to build and an education to pay.

- 1. Academics & educational achievement through teachers who make the lessons very interesting by following various methods of teaching viz. demonstration, experimentation, project work, home assignment, play way micro teaching structure method etc.
- 2. Nurturing intellectual ability.
- 3. Inculcating sense of values and rational thinking.
- 4. Developing scientific and rational thinking.
- 5. Developing the ability to distinguish the right from the wrong the fact from the fiction.
- 6. Encouraging community feeling, a sense of justice and quality of tolerance.
- 7. Developing self-confidence with a sense of responsibility, devotion, patriotism and discipline.
- 8. Developing awareness of environmental preservation.
- 9. Developing leadership qualities in every walk of life.
- 10. To inculcate a sound grounding of ancient Vedic Culture.

Assembly and moral Education

To inculcate moral values in the students the school starts each working day with the morning assembly, with the recitation of Vedic Mantras, devotional songs, patriotic songs and thought for the day. Stress is laid on the universal aspects and eternal values of Indian Culture. Short talks are given by the students and the teachers on a variety of subjects and important current events. The news is read by the students daily. Every morning the assembly is dispersed with the singing of the National Anthem.

Hawan yajna is performed every Saturday and Dharma Shiksha books are prescribed to imbibe in students moral values. Vedic initiation camps are held twice a year.

Learning through Interaction

The school is a platform for fruitful interaction between the two which means a healthy learning experience and better quality of education. To inculcate the feeling of togetherness, the spirit of shared learning interaction and the exchange of ideas amongst the teacher are very important. The teachers armed with love and patience would, penetrate the impressionable minds of the young ones.

Emphasis on pre-primary Education

Keeping in view the most formative part of a child's life our pre-primary section functions as a catalyst to accelerate optimum development of a child. Development of a young child is a continuous process and is influenced by a child's experiences which have a bearing on his/her attitudes towards most of the situations he/she is likely to face later in life. The child's mind set is thus activated to absorb the essence of story telling, recitation and rhymes which capture their imagination when narrated with meaningful actions and body language. Early education is thus the most significant tool for responding to certain areas critical in the later stages of development of a child.

Sports & Co-Curricular Activities

- 1. **Games and Sports:** The school aims at an all round development of the students. The children get an excellent opportunity to develop their interest and ability in the games and sports under the guidance of trained instructors. Annual sports give an opportunity to students to participate in different sporting events.
- 2. Art and Craft: While science relates to intellect and inventions, Art and Craft stir the emotions. The school has a separate art and craft section where the varied creative interests of students are taken care of under the guidance and supervision of professionally trained teachers. Artwork and paintings are exhibited from time to time so as to provide expression and recognition of their talent.
- **3. Yoga:** In order to achieve the integral growth of mind and body and self-management of behaviour, thoughts and attitudes the practice of YOGA is important which is a part of the curriculum in the school. This helps the students to cope with any kind of stress adversity.
- **4. Music & Dance :** Apart from their studies, the school provides music & dance training to the students for their overall development. It reduces their burden of hectic schedule of studies and gives them ample time for their recreation. In fact, it soothes the minds of the students and makes them active.



- 5. Drawings Painting: The students get excellent training in learning drawing and painting in the ever guidance of our art teacher.
- 6. Co-Curricular Activities: The child is exposed to co-curricular activities like reading, sketching, dancing and public speaking and ensure that discipline become the second nature of the child. Individual and consistent monitoring of every student enables the teacher to recognize the field in which a particular child can excel. Children with similar interests and inclinations are grouped together and the teachers help them to nurse and cultivate their talents.

Quiz show, debate, group/solo dance etc. are among various items which are taken one by one to organize contest among the house. A regular record of the excellent performers is maintained and such star performers are sent as and when required to participate in the inter school competitions.

Registration & Admission

- Prospectus & registration forms for admission to the school can be obtained from the school office on cash payment.
- 2. It should be duly filled and submitted with the required documents and certificates as mentioned in the form, by stipulated date.
- 3. Registration fee is not refundable and registration is no guarantee for admission.
- 4. Direct admission for Pre. Nursery Std. VI students.
- Special consideration for transfer cases, children from army background or from the growing schools of neighbouring areas.
- The birth certificate from the competent authority and the transfer certificate obtained from the previous school are essential at the time of admission.
- 7. Fee have to be deposited by the stipulated dates, failing which the seat will be allotted to the next wait listed candidate.

Age criteria

The basic age criteria for admission to classes Nursery & Prep (informal education) and class I (formal education) is to be met according to the birth certificates issued by the municipal corporation or any competent authority as given hereunder.

Identity Card

An identity card bearing the passport size photograph and the address of the student will remain in his/ her custody all the time.

Progress Report

- 1. Parents are kept regularly informed of their wards academic progress and participation in co-curricular activities.
- 2. Two summative assessments are conducted during the academic year along with two Formative assessments before each summative assessment.

First Summative Assessment : April - Sep. Second Summative Assessment : Oct. - March

Attendance

- 1. 75% attendance is essential for promotion to the next higher class.
- 2. No leave is granted except on prior application from parents/guardians for genuine reasons.
- In case of sickness a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner has to be submitted.
- 4. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained leave for fifteen consecutive days renders a student to have his name struck off the rolls. He/she will be readmitted with readmission charges.
- 5. It is compulsory for student to attend the school on the first and the last day after Summer Vacation, Puja Vacation and Winter Vacation.
- 6. Leave application has to be submitted to the class teacher for prior information or else the student will be fined.

Parents Corner

Do's

- 1. Use the school diary as a means of communication with the class teacher and check the diary for home work and the teacher's remarks if any.
- 2. See the test/papers as and when sent home.
- 3. Send the children regularly and punctually to school. No absence will be permitted without a leave application and late comers will not be allowed to sit in the class.
- 4. Both the parents must attend the Parent Teacher Meet.

Don'ts

- 1. Do not walk into the classroom or meet the teacher in the classroom. Please see the teacher with prior appointment through principal.
- 2. Do not visit the teachers at their residence.
- 3. Do not send money or valuable articles with the students. The school takes no responsibility in case those are lost.

Transport

The school has transport facility as per the convenience of the children. The transport routes are specified and buses will ply accordingly.

Guideline For Parents

- Withdrawal from any class must be preceded by a month's notice in writing or a month's fee in lieu of notice.
- 2. All dues will have to be cleared before a transfer certificate is issued.
- 3. Transfer certificate will be issued after one week of receipt of the application.
- 4. School authorities may ask without prior notice to the parents to withdraw the child from the school on any of the following grounds.
- A) Academics: Constant neglect of studies as those who fail in the same class for two consecutive session.
- B) Disciplinary: Those students whose conduct in the opinion of the principal is harmful to the interest of the school.

Guideline For Students

- 1. All the students must posses school diary, text-books, note books etc.
- 2. Books, magazines and articles (other than those required for every day studies) brought to the school are liable to be confiscated.
- 3. Students are advised not to bring valuable articles to the school. The school will not be responsible for any goods getting lost.
- 4. School bus users must strictly observe the rules of the school transport. They must follow the instruction of the driver and the conductor.
- 5. Application for leave must be submitted a day in advance. It should be counter signed by the parent/guardian.
- 6. Students must come in school uniform.
- 7. They must be clean, neat and tidy.
- 8. Students are not allowed to leave the school during working hours unless the parents/ guardians whose signature are on the forms and school diary come in person.
- 9. Students should be regular in attendance.
- 10. Any damage to the school property by the student will have to be borne by the students parents/guardians.
- 11. The school reserves the right to take stern action even to strike off the name of the students from the school rolls who are found guilty of misconduct.









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
